ANOTHER YEAR SAME PIFFLE



I had no idea just how profoundly a brief ten-day stay in the Alfred Hospital's Intensive Care Unit would impact my entire life—but it did, and it still does to this day.

My life changed in January 2023, and unfortunately, not for the better.

To explain: my kidneys completely failed | my lungs were infected with a very aggressive (new) strain of pneumonia | the infection entered my bloodstream, making me toxic and dangerously close to death | my heart struggled immensely to cope with everything.

Saying I was weak after dialysis would be a serious understatement, but my family's support was unwavering—a fact I will always remember. My sisters and I had never been particularly close, but something shifted during that time, and I don't believe it will change back... at least, I hope not.

Two years later, my health remains uncertain, returning to my previous level of functioning seems impossible, and my financial situation is far from good (in fact, it's quite disastrous).

Some might say it was a life lesson, teaching me that I'm no longer young and need to slow down, live healthier, adopt a more sustainable lifestyle, and appreciate what I do have.

I am deeply thankful for the ongoing support from my family and true friends, and I will try to live better, but I must admit it's very difficult and has helped me understand why some people consider suicide—I have thought about it more than once. Being alone doesn't help—I thank my ex-boyfriend for that.

It's a case of c'est la vie—I hope you're well and happy.

Celebrated fashion photographer Marco Ovando is proud to announce the release of Dolls Volume 3, the highly anticipated third installment in his acclaimed photography book series that spotlights the global phenomenon of drag. Shot in an array of unexpected locations - from mall parking lots and gritty basements to striking outdoor backdrops - the photographs balance high-fashion polish with raw theatrical energy. Exclusive content includes moments from the recent European leg of the Werq the World tour, the latest cast of RuPaul's Drag Race Live!, and showstopping portraits of queens like Morphine, Plane Jane, and Ginger Minj.

"At the end of the day, the goal is always to create a beautiful image," Ovando says. "But with drag, lighting becomes the biggest key to accomplishing that. It's what brings the illusion to life."


Having worked with drag talent for over twenty years - including queens from the very first season of RuPaul's Drag Race - Ovando has built deep relationships with his subjects. That trust is at the heart of his ability to capture drag in such an intimate, respectful way. "It's important the queens know I'm there to showcase them at their best," he shares. "Something I'd never do is photograph them when they're not ready or aware. We're selling an illusion. It's essential to honor that."

More than a photography collection, Dolls Volume 3 is a cultural document; a celebration of drag's increasing influence on fashion, pop culture, and visual storytelling. "Drag, fashion, and photography are more interconnected now than they were in the early days," says Ovando. "Fashion designers are referencing the dolls in their collections and the dolls, in turn, are shaping the future of fashion."

For Ovando, the Dolls series is both a love letter to drag and a visual archive of a transformative era. "This book celebrates the art of drag and its beauty," he says. "I want people to remember this moment in time through my work and I hope it inspires the next generation."

q connect: CONNECTing FOR A CAUSE

'CONNECT' is Australia's first federally funded program that dispenses free HIV self-test kits from vending machines. The project aims to strengthen pathways to services, treatment and support while addressing barriers to testing experienced by newly arrived migrants, international students, and people from culturally and linguistically diverse (CALD) backgrounds.

Led by SAMESH since March 2022, and now Thorne Harbour Health SA, the eight vending machines around the Adelaide metropolitan area have been gaining traction with people from all walks of life wanting to self-test for free. Accessing a HIV self-test kit is simple, anonymous, completely safe and includes links to confirmatory testing and care. Just head to one of the vending machine locations, scan the QR code, answer a few confidential questions and provide a valid mobile number, then follow the instructions provided.

As the most successful project of its kind globally, CONNECT is proving that the distribution of free HIV self-test kits via vending machines increases testing amongst priority populations. This plays an important role in reaching the UNAIDS targets in Australia. The Commonwealth Department of Health and Aged Care recently approved funding for a national rollout over 2 years, so CONNECT will be available in every state and territory nation-wide very soon.

SAMESH is a partnership between SHINE SA and Thorne Harbour Health that provides community-based support, education and training about Sexual Health and HIV.



q family: THREE BABIES, ONE DONOR, AND A WHOLE LOT OF PRIDE AT THE SWANS GAME

Hilary and Amy Harris never imagined their road to parenthood would span seven years, multiple fertility clinics and over \$70,000. But, as they welcome their third son who is just a few days old - joining Bowie (2) and Remy (1), they're reflecting on the resilience, love and support that carried them through.

The couple, who are both teachers living in Mudgee, NSW, met in 2015 when Hilary was 19 and Amy was 23. By 2017 they were already dreaming of a family, inspired by a university lecturer of Hilary's who shared her own fertility journey as part of a same-sex couple. They had no idea how complex and emotionally exhausting the path ahead would be.



"We bounced around a few clinics, starting with IUI (intrauterine insemination) treatments using donor sperm," said Hilary. "We didn't have any medical issues but none of the cycles worked. It was disheartening."

They switched clinics, tried tracking Amy's cycle more closely, and did another three IUIs. But with their wedding approaching in 2019 and funds running low, they hit the pause button.

That year, they asked a friend to be their known donor and began trying home insemination. After months without success, they moved on to IVF in 2020 at a private clinic. Amy had a strong response to the medication, but after six failed transfers and no clear answers, the emotional and physical toll was a lot.

"We were completely drained," Hilary said. "It's hard enough going through failed cycles, but when you're not being listened to by the clinic, it is even harder."

Eventually, they found a community-based donor through Sperm Donation Australia and returned to home insemination while waiting to access IVF treatment. That's when Amy fell pregnant naturally with their first son, Bowie, born in October 2022.

"After four years of heartbreak, it finally happened - and not through a clinic," said Hilary. "We couldn't believe it."

Soon after Bowie was born, Hilary began trying but experienced reproductive health issues that made conceiving more difficult, however the couple remained hopeful. Then, they ran into another roadblock - the clinic they had planned on using for treatment had paused its donor program.

That's when they discovered Adora Fertility, a private clinic that prioritises affordable and accessible treatment. Their known donor agreed to participate, and the process began in late 2023.

"There were no surprises, no hidden fees," said Hilary. "Everything was transparent from day one. We undertook the mandatory counselling, the sperm quarantining and had a clear plan."



While all of that was happening, they decided to try home insemination again with Amy, who fell pregnant with their second son Remy in October 2023. Remy was born in July 2024.

Late 2024, Hilary began her first cycle with Adora. Just weeks later, she found out she was pregnant with their third boy, Teddy, who arrived just days ago!

"After everything it was such a relief. This pregnancy has been challenging mentally because of our history, but I've been lucky overall," said Hilary.

The Harris family is proof of how inclusive and affordable fertility care can change lives - and this weekend's Sydney Swans AFL Pride Game at the SCG is a celebration of exactly that.

First played in 2016 as a joint initiative between the Swans and St Kilda.



the Pride Game has become a bold statement of LGBTQIA+ inclusion in football. With Adora Fertility

as the match day partner, the game also highlights the growing visibility of rainbow families and the importance of accessible fertility care for all.

"It's really special to be a part of something that celebrates families like ours," she said.

Their three sons have been conceived all using the same donor.

"We'll talk about someone special who helped us have them, when the time is right," said Hilary. "When they're older, we'll revisit how much we share. But it's important they know where they come from."

Reflecting on their journey, the couple says Adora stood out not only for affordability but for its care and communication. Appointments were held mostly virtually, with scans and blood



tests done locally in Mudgee. They only travelled to Sydney for egg retrieval and embryo transfer.

Their advice to other LGBTQIA+ couples is to start early and research your options - and don't equate high prices with better care.

"Some of the most expensive clinics gave us the worst experiences," Hilary said. "Adora made us feel respected and informed every step of the way."

Always online, never present? How travelers are reclaiming digital boundaries

Digital detox retreats, silent yoga camps, and "offline holidays" may be all over Instagram, but a new trend is emerging: Travelers who want to disconnect — yet still expect to be connected everywhere.

Ironically, technologies like eSIM apps are enabling digital detox experiences by removing the stress of figuring out connectivity.



July marked the release of the fifty-third book in the Elska series, a project dedicated to exploring the world and its men through a gay lens. This latest edition focuses on Mexico City, one of the most vibrant, exciting and queer places on Earth. Inside, readers can get to know a cross-section of local gay men through a blend of intimate photography and personal storytelling.

"Over the past year, more of our readers have requested us to make an issue in Mexico City than anywhere else, so we had to give the people what they wanted" says Elska editor, writer and chief photographer Liam Campbell. "This marks our fifth time featuring a Latin American location, and yet again, the results have exceeded all expectations. The mixture of vibrant queer life and gorgeous men makes this part of the world the ideal stomping ground for Elska."

"The openness of people here seemed to lead to a certain audaciousness as well. For only the second time in our fifty-three issue history, every participant in Elska

Mexico City opted to bare all for their photoshoots. What's more, there wasn't the least bit of nervousness or even any coyness, only freeness and pride. I'm almost tempted to make all future Elskas in South America — t's just so refreshing to immerse oneself in a community that is so positive and liberated!"

The text in Elska Mexico City was formed from extensive diaries taken during the trip to the city, centred around details of the time spent with around a dozen local men met there, including conversations and activities shared. These men were also invited to take part in a photoshoot, encompassing a combination of scenes in the streets dressed in their own style and at home undressed. The result is a fully immersive and unabashedly queer reading experience.

'Hey, can I stay and watch?' he asked loudly, not knowing who was the decision maker. 'Sure,' said Scott nonchalantly, from the other room.



Get ready Gabriel. Your porn debut is about to begin. Let us all, your praises sing On the hunk's cock, you will be striding Little red hood, will be riding



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
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
