Latin Pop Sensation Jaime Adrian Exudes Turn-of-the-Millennium Vibes
In No Agenda, his new album that features a slick re-imagining of the late nineties dance
classic, "If You Could Read My Mind"

If listeners pick up an early 2000s vibe in Jaime Adrian's new album, they should know it was intentional. "I think my brain is stuck in the early millennium because that era of music was simply fun with no agenda and that's the kind of vibe I live by," he explains.

In fact, he titled the album, No Agenda, and in it, he dips into multiple genres of dance music from Latin beat to country twists, house tracks and euro pop. "I didn't want people to say it all sounds the same."



The out, Latino artist grew up on the east side of Chicago in a very Catholic neighborhood. He recalls kids making fun of him for his love of singing, calling it "not something a real man would do" and for years, they managed to silence his voice. Then The X Factor came calling.

Jaime Adrian flew to Kansas City and after performing for the preliminary judges, he learned he had made it to the live show auditions! The show did not go as planned, however. After being crucified by the judges, he spent the rest of the day crying in his hotel room from embarrassment, determined to stop singing.

"If you would have told me then that I'd have a completed album in 2024, I wouldn't have believed it," he acknowledges today. "This journey has been the hardest thing I've ever done but it's worth it to take a chance on life and to keep shooting for the stars."

Why did you title your debut album, No Agenda?

Jaime Adrian: What I mean by the title is that I'm not trying to shove my views, politics, religion, sexuality, or ethnicity down anyone's throats. I made No Agenda because I simply wanted a really good pop album that reflects on the work of musicians who influenced me growing up.

Isn't pushing lifestyle and politics what millennials are known for?

Jaime Adrian: (Laughing) Not me! From a young age, I learned that showing kindness is

more affective then screaming or bullying people into thinking my way. I would rather be known as a kind human than simply a gay or Latino artist, or one of the other labels I happen to be. Ever since I was a kid I've been stereotyped and I've hated it. I never seemed to fit in anywhere. Today, I just want to do me and as long as I'm not hurting anyone, I should be allowed to do so. A cool thing I was told recently is that I inspire other people who, like me, don't fit the typical mold. I love that.

What inspired you to remake "If You Could Read Mv Mind"?

Jaime Adrian: My producer, Velvet Code, thought that it would be cool to do a cover of an iconic nineties dance song. "If You Could Read My Mind" was the first that came to mind. It's a song I've always been obsessed with since I first heard it in the 1998 film, 54.

Let me guess, did young Jaime Adrian have a crush on Ryan Phillipe?

Jaime Adrian: Hell yeah! Between 54, Cruel Intentions, and I Know What You Did Last Summer, I used to want to have curly blonde hair just like him. That face, body, even the way he talks makes me melt.



Who did you love more as a teen, Ryan or Britney Spears?

Jaime Adrian: Oh, Britney Spears without a doubt. Britney's a triple threat! She dances, sings, acts and I just love the personality she projects in her interviews.

Tell us about performing live in front of Britney on TV's The X Factor.

Jaime Adrian: It was probably the most traumatic thing I've experienced in my life. I was bullied and made fun of in front of the woman who has shaped my career and she just sat there and looked uncomfortable. I still have nightmares about it to this day. What I should have said or done... I can't change the past now.

Do you have hard feelings?

Jaime Adrian: Not with Britney. I'm more upset with the male judges for trying to break me down. I used to love Louie Walsh on The X Factor UK. I can't stand the sight of him anymore. LA Reid is no better.

What about Demi Lovato?

Jaime Adrian: Demi was kind. She complimented my voice but said I needed to pick better songs. However, I didn't get to pick the song for The X Factor. When the producers learned how much I loved Britney, they convinced me that she would want to hear me perform one of her songs. I fell for it.

Producers can be mean!

Jaime Adrian: They can be nice, too. I especially loved one of the show's producers, Elaina. She discovered me in the crowd during the audition process and really pushed for me to get as far as I could on the show. We remain great friends to this day and she has continued to be a big supporter of my music.

What inspired you to complete No Agenda?

Jaime Adrian: After I released my single, "Feed My Ego," people came out of the woodwork, complimenting my work. At first, I thought they were making fun of me, but the more songs my producer and I released, the more praise we received.

And you saved and paid for the album out of your own pocket?

Jaime Adrian: Yes, I continue to work six days a week to pay for all of this myself and still find the time to make the music and pay my bills. My two dogs aren't cheap either, so it's been a journey, for sure.

A worthwhile journey, wouldn't you say?

Jaime Adrian: I want nothing more than to reach people I will probably never meet and to hold the hand of someone I will likely never actually feel. If one of my songs touches another soul, then it's been worth it.



Girl VS Divorce by Ken Harrip LL.B Available now where all good books are sold.

Ken Harrip is a former lawyer who studied his bachelor of law at the Queensland University of Technology. Ken practiced in family law for a number of years and is now a member of the family law section of the law council of Australia.

Although the title suggests that the book is aimed at women facing divorce, this is not actually the case. It's an insightful book about various topics when facing divorce, but for the purpose of this review, I will be focusing on a chapter specifically written for same sex couples (the book also outlines this term to include all members of the LGBTIQA+ community).

Aimed at same sex couples, chapter nine is incredibly accurate when describing the challenges that same sex couples face when facing divorce. It also highlights that when dealing with divorce within our community, it is still relatively new within the world and not everyone is on board with accepting same sex marriage and divorce. Homophobia and transphobia is still very much alive within the world, and sadly within law enforcement (not always the case, the law enforcement within Australia are incredibly diverse and deserve due credit).



Ken highlights issues such as the homophobia and transphobia still in the world and explains that even members of our own community can be judgemental towards couples going through divorce. The legal advice and suggestions within this chapter are

towards couples going through divorce. The legal advice and suggestions within this chapter are amazing for members of our community because Ken is correct, marriage equality is still new, and has not yet been perfected, so naturally the divorce proceedings and processes have not yet been perfected.

The chapter also provides comfort for those who do not know a lot about legal rights and procedures within same sex marriage, along with providing a chapter on children within the marriage, and what to do when you want to start again.

Perhaps most importantly, he provides information on what to do and where to go and who to turn to (LGBTIQA Friendly law officials) when being faced with domestic violence issues. I cannot stress enough that domestic violence affects EVERYONE, regardless of gender identity and/or sexuality! And is NOT OK!

I am very happy to read the advice and steps and contacts in relations to all things divorce specifically catering to our community. Ken has really taken the time to think carefully about this chapter and speaks on issues that affect us specifically. It was a refreshing change to see a taboo subject being written about in such a careful, kind, respectful and knowledgeable context.

The other chapters within the book were indeed wonderful to read. If you, someone you know, or someone you think could benefit from a friendly read about divorce, I highly recommend Girl VS Divorce. Let's face it, nobody ever gets married with the intention to become divorced, but sadly it does happen, and when it does, not everyone has the ability to be cool, calm and collected about it, let alone knowledgable about divorce. This book will help many people, from all walks of life who face divorce.



JONNY MCGOVERN IS GAY AF
As the host of Hey Qween! and his dishy new podcast show

Jonny McGovern's career in entertainment launched twenty years ago with Dirty Gay Hits, his collection of gay themed songs that received over five million downloads before YouTube even existed. It caught the eye of Rosie O'Donnell, who cast McGovern as a lead player on her comedy show, The Big Gay Sketch Show alongside Oscar nominee Coleman Domingo and SNI's Kate McKinnon.

Today, Jonny McGovern is best known for his popular television shows including GoGo for the



Gold (second season streaming now on OUTtv) and Hey Qween!, his talk show streaming new episodes now, exclusively on World of Wonder's SVOD platform WOW Presents Plus. For even more gay laughs and hijinks, you can catch him in Jonny McGovern is Gay AF, the comedian's new weekly podcast show where he puts a homo spin on all of the latest celeb news. We spoke with Jonny McGovern from his home in LA.

What is like to be gay AF in Hollywood today?

JM: There's never been a better time to be gay AF!

Gay comedians are hot right now! There's Fortune Feimster, Matteo Lane, Tig Notaro, Bob the Drag Queen... the list goes on and on.

JM: Yes, it's great. I think apps like TikTok have really helped make this possi-ble. The take a lot of the gatekeeping away. It's no longer some straight person telling you what you can and cannot talk about. The audience can decide for themselves what they find is funny, and when something or someone gets a big reaction from a digital audience, comedy clubs and the industry take notice.

Were you always gay AF?

JM: I may have tried to hide it in my younger years, but when I stopped trying to be what society told me was proper and started fully expressing my true self is when I started to make a name for myself.

What inspired you to launch your new podcast, Jonny McGovern is Gay AF?

JM: I started podcasting in 2006 and my podcast audience has been my most devoted audience. I have people that have been riding with me for almost twen-ty years and that's really special.

Gay Pimpin' was a real pioneer in LGBTQ podcasting!

JM: We were the first gay show to crack the top 10 of iTunes podcasts.

How is Jonny McGovern is Gay AF different from Gay Pimpin '?

JM: Spiritually, they are both from the same place.. Format wise, they are differ-ent. Gay Pimpin' was a snapshot of my life at the time with a very large group of friends on the mic with me. Gay AF is more intimate. It's created to be like you, as the listener, are sitting down with me one on one to gossip, throw shade, kiki about which OnlyFans accounts are good and which are not worth our coins. We break down the stories of the day and deep dive into DL gay celebrity scan-dals and blind items.

Where do you find the topics?

JM: I keep a list of everything that I see that stands out as "of homosexual inter-est" on social media, in magazines, movies, TV. and music. From diva rap bat-tles like Nicki vs. Megan to the gay couple airport meltdown to Diddy's



alleged gay sex parties; no topic is off limits!

How did your podcast shows prepare you for Hey Qween!?

JM: I was working in nightlife while recording The Gay Pimpin' shows and I spent a lot of time with drag queens and ballroom legends. It was a natural evo-lution to make Hey Qween! a place where queens share their journeys.

Congratulations on the show moving to Wow Presents Plus!

JM: This season, we have access like never before to the world's top queens! We are the first sit down TV interview for the eliminated queens of season 16 of RuPaul's Drag Race, so we get the tea piping hot! Not only do I have some of Drag Race's Emmy winning producers working with me on the show, but we're also able to get call-ins from Drag Race legends and we regularly feature actual iconic props from the season.

The girls' elimination airs on Friday and Hey Qween comes out on Monday afternoons at 3:30 PM on WOWPresentsPlus! There's so much Drag Race conversation, it feels great to be in the eye of the storm and on the mother ship of WOW.

No doubt the late Lady Red Couture is smiling down from heaven at your success.

JM: It's bittersweet to have finally gotten to this place that we always dreamed of traveling together and not have Lady Red beside me. She's with me in spirit and I keep a candle with her picture on it next to me on the desk so she's al-ways represented. I miss her and I know she's up in heaven cheering me on.

Speaking of legendary angels, what would Dorian Corey or Pepper LaBeija think of the state of LGBTQ+ representation in entertainment today?

JM: Paris is Burning and all of the people in that movie have been extremely inspirational to me. I would hope they would love it and be huge TikTok stars, especially Dorian Corey who I quote to this day! I would've loved to have seen all those divas as judges on Legendary.

Is there anything you will not ask an eliminated queen?

JM: We want the tea, but I never want to ask anything that's going to make any-one feel or look bad. These queens are our homegrown stars and we aim to celebrate them.

What would the house mothers of Paris is Burning have to say to the new crop of queens competing on RuPaul's Drag Race?

JM: If you shoot an arrow and it goes real high, hooray for you.

This may sound like fantasy, but I bet if I asked them, and pitched this idea to them, they might just agree and join in. All men together.






