A stirring, sensual dance piece that takes the audience on a journey of expression

'CROSSFADE was a stirring, sensual dance piece that took the audience on a journey of expression, and commanded the destruction of gender inequality' - Scenestr Magazine

A performance where costume not only represents our constantly evolving and definitive roles, but one which uncovers how we can successfully mask and shape our identities through image and dress, to fit within or bust out of social constructs. CROSSFADE is a performance very much based on the garment, and is a stirring mix of dance, burlesque and cabaret.

The title borrows from a production/editing term, which means to fade between two images, but here we've adopted it as a kind of metaphor for what it is we are exploring; to crossfade between and within gender roles. The work is composed of interconnected vignettes. CROSSFADE draws upon different periods in time creating a heady mix be it sound bites, iconic moments from film, news hours and of course, pop culture. Highly visual, beautifully crafted, this performance sees some of Melbourne's finest creatives come together in the splendor that is The Melba Spiegel Tent, for a very special, late night foray that delves deep into the idea of our self constructed image.

q world: INTERPRIDE

The South of France welcomes the Global Pride Movement
2016 joint InterPride/EPOA AGM & World Conference is held in Montpellier, France

Le Corum in the Mediterranean French city of Montpellier was a hub of activity from the 12th to the 16th of October as the Boards of both InterPride – the International Association of Pride Organisers – and EPOA – the European Pride Organisers Association held their Annual General Meetings and World Conference. This is only the second time in InterPride's 35 years that the two organisations have held a joint conference and only the 10th time InterPride has held its AGM & World Conference outside of the USA.

Approximately 180 delegates from the USA, Canada, Australia, South Korea, Europe and the UK were in attendance.

Along with the various social events, including but limited to, the first ever public conference featuring the French members of parliament who were instrumental in the passing of Marriage Equality in the country and leaders of InterPride, EPOA and Fierté Montreal, a WorldPride 2017 Madrid Reception and only the second time a Pride March was held at a World Conference, the AGM also had the duty of passing one very significant ByLaw change (5 years in the making) and the election of half the Executive of InterPride.



The staging of Fierté Montpellier was particularly significant as the organisation had to cancel their original March due to the massacre in Nice earlier in the year.

Passing to rapturous applause, InterPride finally added the position of Vice President of Operations – Trans* Identified to its Executive Committee. In addition to the election of Secretary, Vice President of Operations – Male Identified and Vice President Member Services, Melbourne's Brett Hayhoe was re-elected for a second term as Co-President – Male Identified.

Mr. Hayhoe said of his re-election, *"I am truly honoured, humbled and privileged to have been re-elected as Co-President of InterPride for a further two year term. Thank you to our amazing members - many of whom have become great friends. I look forward to working with all of the new Board to advance the Global Pride Movement. Viva la difference."*

Mr. Hayhoe's election, and subsequent re-election, is the first time in the history of InterPride where a Co-President has been elected from the southern hemisphere. This will be his final two years on the Executive as per the term limits of the organisation.

Next year the organisation will return to the USA for their AGM & World Conference in Indianapolis, Indiana then in 2018 go to Saskatoon, Saskatchewan, Canada – which was awarded the hosting rights at this conference.

One of the other duties of the AGM & World Conference is to choose an International Pride Theme. This is particularly significant for smaller Prides that don't have the resources to pay for graphics, as they are supplied by InterPride for exclusive Member use. 2017 will adopt the WorldPride 2017 Theme of Viva la Vida while 2018's Theme, chosen at this year's conference, will be Remember the Past, Create the Future.

Jack'd Is Charging Big Business For Millennial's Gay Dates
Leading Gay Social App Woo-ing Urban Millennials with No-Charge Hook-Ups

Contrary to a recent Bloomberg report that dating apps are switching over to pay models, Jack'd, a popular hook-up app for gay urban millennials, says it will remain free. "Our research continues to show that our targeted demographic does not pay for music, games, movies, or dating," says Phil Henricks, VP of Strategy and Business Development at Online Buddies, the parent company of Jack'd. "They've been raised to expect that digital products are free and they don't see any reason to start paying for them now."

Jack'd's path to monetization is through selling advertising to corporations eager to reach the hard-to-find gay, urban millennial. "They're a multi million dollar demographic", continues Henricks. "While they're not willing to purchase digital products, they have tremendous buying power and have no problem shelling out \$5 on a cup of coffee or \$200 on a pair of sneakers."

More than 60% of Jack'd's revenue comes from Fortune 500 companies, clothing retailers, and the tourism industry, all of whom have run banners on the app in recent weeks. "We see it as a win for everyone. We attract the gay, urban millennials that our members want and our advertisers have a quick, easy way to reach them."

Nearly five million men around the world have joined Jack'd since its launch in 2010 and it consistently ranks among the top four gay social apps in both the App Store and Google Play. 67% of Jack'd members in the United States are between 18-26. Nearly 60% are Black and Latino.

"Members appreciate that our free version offers many of the premium features they would have to pay for on competing apps," adds Alon Rivel, Jack'd's Brand Manager.

As for banners, Henricks says Jack'd members are not bothered by them, citing only 3% of members have opted to pay for Jack'd to avoid the banners. "They understand that someone has to pay for the app. As long as it's not them, they don't give it a second thought."

q travel: with BARRIE MAHONEY

Fuerteventura and the Nazis

The Canary Island of Fuerteventura is usually associated with beautiful beaches, breath-taking scenery and plenty of wind to indulge in some of those energetic water sports. The island is also particularly popular with German and British tourists, but very little is known or discussed about the darker side of Fuerteventura's history, involving Nazi Germany. Over the many years that I have visited and explored the island, I have had the opportunity to meet with and discuss the story with many local people who know the property and its history well. This is the intriguing story of Villa Winter...

Villa Winter is an impressive, mysterious and very large building situated close to the village of Cofete, on the Jandia peninsular. The villa was built in a remote spot, and is accessible only on a dust track by heavy duty 4-wheel drive vehicles. Villa Winter belonged to Gustav Winter, who was a German engineer born in Germany's Black Forest in 1893. It is thought that the villa was built in 1937, although official records appear to have been modified to 1946, for reasons that will become apparent later in this story. The villa has two floors, with a tower in the north western part of the property, and a balcony at the front.

Since 1915, Gustav Winter worked for Spain on projects in Gran Canaria and Fuerteventura. In 1937, he signed a lease for the Jandia peninsular from the Conde de Santa Coloma, based in Lanzarote. That same year, Winter left the island for Germany, in order to seek funding. In 1939, local people were barred from the peninsular, which was declared a military zone, due to agreements between General Franco and Adolf Hitler.

The road to the villa, as well as the villa itself, were built by prisoners of war from the concentration camp at Tefia, which later became the island's airport. The building has vast, dark cellars and caves stretching beneath it, and includes a large tower that looks out to sea. It is often suggested that it was built to act as a watch tower for sightings of possible aircraft landings at the nearby airfield of Jandia, as well as a beacon for submarines. Intriguingly, the tower still contains evidence of an enormous fuse box indicating that large and power hungry equipment was used in the tower.

There is well documented evidence of submarines sited around the Canary Islands during the Second World War, and between March and July 1941 submarines visited the harbour of Las Palmas de Gran Canaria a number of times. There continues to be speculation that Fuerteventura was the home of a submarine base, and there are reports of two tunnels built under the mountains, dug into the lava tunnels of an extinct volcano that were used for U boats. Some say that there are still two complete submarines in it, which are claimed to have sunk. This suggestion was investigated by a team of experts from Austria and Spain in the 1970s, yet they lost their lives when their boat exploded during the investigation and their work remains unconfirmed.

There are many stories about Villa Winter, but one common theme is that its role was a safe house for the Nazis. At the end of the war, it is thought by many that a number of Nazi leaders, including Adolf Hitler, arrived on the island, where plastic surgery was undertaken to change their identities before they escaped to South America, and with Argentina being a favoured destination, since Peron was a friend and ally of Hitler. We have been told for many years that Hitler and his wife, Eva Braun, committed suicide in an underground bunker in April 1945. According to accounts and propaganda at the time, their bodies were then taken outside and burned by loyal staff before being deposited in a shallow grave. Many experts now believe the story to be untrue and was concocted between the Allies at the end of the war. It is suggested that Hitler travelled from Germany to Fuerteventura where a U boat was waiting to take him to Argentina where he ended his days.

In 1971, Gustav Winter died on the neighbouring island of Gran Canaria. Both he and his widow denied the many stories surrounding the mysterious Villa Winter until their deaths. A distant relative of Gustav Winter attempted to turn the villa into a wellness centre some years ago, but the plans failed. The villa is currently owned by a Spanish building company and will probably be eventually converted into a hotel or restaurant. Whatever the truth is behind this mysterious building, there remain many unsolved mysteries and speculation surrounding Villa Winter, and many inconsistencies and secrecy remain.

The Kit Kat Club is returning to Melbourne in all its decadence for a new Australian revival of CABARET playing at The Athenaeum Theatre from 27 April. To coincide with the 50th anniversary of the Broadway Opening of CABARET, tickets for the Melbourne season will go on sale on 21 November.

Joining the amazing Paul Capsis as Emcee and the already announced Kate Fitzpatrick (Fräulein Schneider) and Debora Krizak (Fräulein Kost) will be Australian actress, singer and leading lady of musical theatre Chelsea Gibb as Sally Bowles. After being told she had the role Chelsea said, "If someone were to offer me a pick of any role, out of all the roles in musical theatre, Sally Bowles has always been my answer. It's literally my biggest career dream coming true, that I'm getting to play her!"

The star studded cast also includes Marcus Graham as Ernst Ludwig, John O'May as Herr Schultz, Jason Kos as Clifford Bradshaw, Michelle Barr as Fritz, Nick Jones as Victor, Matthew Manahan as Gottfried and Michelle Smitheram as Helga.

Winner of 12 Tony Awards, 8 Academy Awards and 7 BAFTA Awards, CABARET wows audiences and critics alike time and time again sky-rocketing the careers its stars. Fifty years ago in 1966 the original Broadway production made a household name of Joel Grey who shook audiences as The Emcee. Two years later an unassuming Judi Dench stole the show as Sally Bowles on London's West End. Arguably the most iconic movie musical of all time made a star of Liza Minnelli when she brought Sally Bowles to the silver screen directed by Bob Fosse.

CABARET in its musical form is based on The Berlin Stories by famous author Christopher Isherwood who exchanged his upper-middle-class conservative upbringing for the sexual freedom and social liberation of Berlin during the bustling 1930s. CABARET the musical, adapted by song and lyrics team Kander and Ebb, became a semi-biographical portrait of Isherwood's life, celebrating life on the edge.

Chelsea Gibb has become one of Australia's leading ladies of Musical Theatre. After graduating from WAAPA (Western Australia Academy of Performing Arts) she was cast as "Roxie Hart" in "CHICAGO", a role she went on to play for four years throughout Australia and South East Asia. Other musical theatre credits include: Reno Sweeny in ANYTHING GOES, Ruby Red in GET HAPPY, Queenie in Andrew Lipka's, THE WILD PARTY, Anna in the critically acclaimed THE KING & I, and new Australian musical's THE NEW BLACK at The Arts Centre, Melbourne, PINK, Amity Dry's FAMOUS and Whitney in the Australian premiere of DREAMSONG. Chelsea also received critical acclaim for her portrayal of Margaret White in the musical CARRIE. Last year she performed with ten of Australia's leading ladies in JERRY'S GIRLS.

AFI award winning and Logie nominated actor Marcus Graham first gained wide acclaim starring in the TV series E Street as 'Wheels'. He has been a professional actor for twenty-eight years and has performed in over eighty productions in theatre, film and television. Marcus has received acclaim in projects including David Lynch's Mulholland Drive, The Rocky Horror Show, The Blue Room, Angels in America, Twelve Angry Men, Noises Off and Holding the Man. Of his extensive television credits Marcus has most recently appeared in the Secret City for Foxtel and as Pastor Rob Shand in Jack Irish. He was recently seen in ABC drama series Cleverman, which was picked up by Sundance TV and the BBC and has just been renewed for a second season.



q books: **TOXIC LOVE**

In her debut novel, author Gabriella Meghan writes a captivating story of romance and murder, set in a small-town lesbian community.

AS TOLD BY US tells the story of Layla, who, after four years of being bullied in high school, seeks to discover herself and come to terms with her true identity. She quickly becomes the town's "It Girl", experiencing love and lust as she weaves her way in and out of relationships with an assortment of young women. But just as she is thriving in her newfound freedom, a string of mysterious suicides among her inner circle of friends threatens to lead Layla toward a twisted journey of undeniable fate.



The story is based on author Gabriella Meghan's own experiences, living and loving in a world she describes as harsh, chaotic and malicious. It explores a darker side of the lesbian community that many may be surprised to learn about: rampant with sex, addiction and mental illness.

Do you worry As Told By Us may give a negative impression of the lesbian community?

I like to think that the book is eye-opening to the realities individuals within the community face everyday.

Would you say its true-to-life?

It is certainly true to life of the community I experienced. The community I experienced was very small and dysfunctional.

Why do you think that was?

My theory is that LGBTQ people have learned to hide who they are by lying to loved ones for fear of being an outcast. We've become better at lying and hiding things, and that makes it easier to be malicious.

Did you base your main character, Layla, on yourself?

Layla's experiences and life are strongly based on my own. Layla and I both went through many changes and obstacles in our late teens and early twenties including divorce, coming out, rebelling, struggling with an eating disorder, being in and breaking free from an abusive relationship, death of friends and more.

Are Layla's lovers based on your real life lovers?

Yes, very much so. I based the character of Jade off an extremely toxic yet passionate relationship I was in. It was abusive in more ways than one, and I didn't realize it while I was in it. I only started to realize the abuse and the intensity of it once I began therapy a few years down the road. A lot of my fears, anxieties, and insecurities stem back to her.

Does your ex still control you?

It was that kind of relationship where no matter how much time goes by, if I see her today, I know she will have an immediate hold on my soul. But I realize I can control those feelings, acknowledge them, and move forward with my life in a positive manner. In a way I am thankful to have had a Jade in my life. I learned a lot of valuable lessons, I became stronger, and I learned that I am capable of accomplishing anything. I have forgiven that person and moved on to a healthy relationship and happy life.

Did you find writing the book to be therapeutic?

As Told By Us was my therapy before therapy! Before ever seeking out a therapist to talk to, I wrote. The book allowed me to tackle the demons of that period of my life. It allowed me to self-reflect, which I think is so incredibly important in order to grow into a better person.

What are your feelings today about the lesbian community?

There are times I miss the chaos, and there are times that I am thankful I made it out in one piece. This past year I travelled to a lot of the United States, met tons of new people, and learned the lesbian community is so much bigger than what I experienced in my small town. Its restored my faith in the community.

What do you hope readers take away from As Told By Us?

I think it is important that we talk about the hardships that many LGBTQ youth go through with drugs, alcohol and addiction. We shouldn't pretend these problems don't exist. Addiction is a serious thing, and we should address it and work together as a community to fight it.
