With these young ladies [all stars in their own right] going from strength to strength right now, I jumped at the chance to speak with Emily about the band and how it was all working out for them. We started our conversation by talking about their new album.

The album is 80's disco. It's such a gay album. Every gay guy I know will love it. Every song, I reckon, is a gay anthem.

What has the band been up to lately?

We've just finished our tour - was supposed to only be 20 shows but ended up being 30 or 40 - so we're really really happy about that. The album of course, and next year we're hoping to go back on tour - although that will depend on how this album goes.

We're actually going to see quite a few tours next year - Anthony Callea, David Campbell, yourselves. I think it will be a great year for music in 2007.

And hopefully more girl bands.

Explain the comparison from being a solo performer to singing in a band please.

I'll tell you the good thing - when you're on stage you don't feel like you're alone. Sometimes being a solo artist you like being by yourself, but in a group you can share the burden. It's so good having Paulini next to me who I can turn to [if I am sick or there is something wrong with my voice at that particular time] and say "can you do this bit for me". Or Ricki will just instantly take over if I have forgotten the words. Everyone just has each others back.

How did Young Divas come about?

3 of us are under the same management, so we were all pretty much together anyway, and we asked Ricki to join us as she was the only one we knew who could fit that mould.

We have seen in recent times quite a proliferation of boy bands - do you feel the next big thing will be girl bands?

I really hope so because there really is only us and Girlband out there at the moment.

Are you writing your own material at this stage or sticking with covers for the meantime?

Well as we're called the Young Divas pretty much any album is a tribute - not just disco but music from when we were growing up as well. So for now it will be covers as we're still coming to terms with the title "Diva".

So how do you think you will live up to that fabulous title?


You tell me! Maybe you can give me some hints on how to live up to it [Oh love, I'm an old Queen not a Diva].

q music: with IAN STARR

I met this young man just recently and decided his story was too good not to tell. I started our chat by asking about the Ian Starr story.

Well Starr by name Star by nature. I started my career early at the age of 4. Singing/dancing/acting and training 7 days a week. Working professionally at the age of 5, I appeared in a series of McDonald commercials before performing alongside Bert Newton in the Wizard of Oz at just 9. After that I was bitten by the showbiz bug. Acting in a string of TV shows - both in Australia and overseas. By the age of 15 I was signed up with a development deal with a record company, but the album never saw the light of day and was shelved. I then went on to be a dance teacher for a Spice Girls Tribute show "the spiced Girls" touring Asia and Australia. I then got into a Boyband called "Boystar" in 2001 - we were flown to New Zealand and basically became an overnight success with a long list of concert tours, magazine and tv interviews and a NO.3 hit single. "Boystar" got signed up in Australia in 2002 with 301Records/MRA - managed by Michael Browning (manager of inxs and ac/dc) and release Australian debut single named "loverboy" which hit number #12 spot first week! The B side single, written by me, was also played on all radio stations across Australia threw Austerio and many others. Confusion over the album release and the merger of sony/bmg caused a rift and the record was not released. 1 month later I left Boystar to pursue a solo career. Even performing on a Greek reality TV game show...shown in 6 countries. So far, the last 2 years I have worked with international hit makers behind Britney Spears, Backstreet boys, Sugababes, Scub 7 and Alcazar.

How would you describe your music?

It is Swedish pop - in other words it is a European dance/pop sound.

You've worked with some fairly impressive names...tell me a little about that.

Well Boystars management Michael Browning was the best in the business at the time.. He was Inxs and Ac/dc's ex-management and propelled them to international fame. Also I was lucky enough to write songs along side Vincent di Giorgio who has written songs for Alcazar, steps, Sugababes and Nsync. But over the last few years I worked with so many Australian celebrities, and they are the nicest ones to work with.

You currently do not have management, how hard do you think it is going to be to get your

name out there?

It's so sad that I don't have management. It's hard to find someone who will commit to the project. There are a lot of people in the industry who are all talk and no action (and they all know who they are). Those people are the ones who have made it hard for me. As for getting my name out there, I think it's going well. I will be headlining Midsumma Carnival day at Treasury gardens on Feb 11 at 4pm and also Pride March on the 21st. They're pretty big shows and I think the audience will be impressed. Being on Myspace has made it easy for me to connect with big people and also fans of my music! [www.myspace.com/ianstarr]

Will we be seeing an album and/or tour any time soon?

For sure! I will be kicking off a club tour real soon so keep your eyes peeled for it. My first single as a solo artist is called Sundown and it was written by the team behind Scub7. It can be previewed on www.myspace.com/ianstarr

Anything else you would like to add?

Im hoping to be Australia's first young gay popstar with major radio play. It will be a hard road, but I think Australia is ready!

We are currently in a vortex of openings, shows, exhibitions. Can we see them all? Can we, I, truly appreciate what I, we, are viewing? Well, it's a simple question with an equally simple answer. No!

To the shock of the masses, we cannot see so much art, skill and talent, and truly appreciate what we are viewing. There is such a thing as art overload, although I don't think it has a name (and if it does, I sure hope that's not what it's called).

This has come as a shock to me - that I have not had the chance to appreciate the full scale of art that is out there. There is just not enough time to properly take it all in, reflect, evaluate and consider.

I will also admit that I had not entered the halls of the new National Gallery of Victoria at Federation Square or the renovated old gallery until recently, yet passing through that wall of water for a few hours used to be a favourite relaxation for me.

At the recent Midsumma launch, I had the chance

to view the works of Juan Davila. This man's works I have admired for years, his ideas have made me believe that contemporary art can continue with the values of the past yet bleed towards a new direction. Okay, another admission. I used to be a card-carrying member of the art police, absolutely against contemporary art. Until I became the manager of one of Melbourne's largest art & craft centres. Here I helped many people use the knowledge of the past to create new artworks using materials and skills learned at the centre. In the process, I was re-educating myself about the value of contemporary art, and quietly let my art police membership lapse.

It took me 20 years to realise an old friend was right: white paint on a white canvas does say something. Consider "Blue Poles", we all thought it was tripe. (Be honest, you did too, didn't you.) But with knowledge and experience I see the true message in these works. I realise it wasn't because Juan Davila was mimicking the past, he is expressing the now. I have always looked to the past in art to find the future but it is amazing to have the current shown in such detail.



To finish, you simply must see the Juan Davila works on display at the NGV International, part of this year's Midsumma. If they offend, bother or cause distress, well, good, because that is what I have learnt. Contemporary art is an expression and ignites a response. If it does the work has succeeded, if not maybe we aren't looking closely enough.

There is a feast of art, exhibitions and installations as part of this year's Midsumma. Go on, be a glutton and see how much you can fit in. I'll see you there.



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

Happy New Year Readers.

I have been thinking of late of Valentine's Day, and how this will be the fourth year in a row that my dance card is empty on February 14th. So I spoil myself as only one should when no one else will, and that's with a very special bottle of wine, or bubbles. I am reminded of a line from the Rubaiyat of Omar Khayyam from the 11th century "Drink! For you know not whence you came, nor why: / Drink! For you know not why you go, nor where."

This month I want to concentrate on special wines, something that you give or receive only once or twice in your life. If you are looking for something unusual to give your significant other or others for Vallies, try one of the following:

1995 Salon Blanc de Blanc Champagne

The House of Salon makes no other wine, only this vintage tête de cuvée Blanc de Blancs and only in the greatest vintages. For this reason, it is the rarest of Champagnes, having released only 30 vintages in the last 76 years. The 1995 vintage was remarkable in Champagne. The wines show finesse and power, a very fine mousse, aromas of citrus and white flowers, very fresh, clean and elegant. Salon is kept on its yeasts in deep limestone cellars in Le Mesnil-sur-Oger until a specific order is received. Salon is then disgorged by hand for each order. If you want a gift of unique quality, go no further but be prepared to shell out \$500 or more for this rare gem. It is an investment piece but if you want to drink

it, pair it with some freshly shucked oysters and sourdough bread.

1998 Henschke Hill of Grace

Often called the poor man's grange, this is a unique wine and would make a perfect gift. Made from 100% shiraz grapes, it is an opaque, purple crimson mauve colour. The nose has tremendous youthful vigour - violets, freshly crushed inky blackcurrants and spice aromas. The palate is as vigorous as the nose, and the youthful fruit flavours are in an abundant flavour bliss. A wine that will be eagerly awaited and will no doubt set a new price benchmark for Hill of Grace, as it is currently retailing at around \$450. If you feel compelled to slurp this one, grill some wagyu beef fillet and some fresh asparagus.

1996 Giaconda Chardonnay

Regular readers will know I am not much a Chardy fan, but I can promise that this is brilliant. From Beechworth in Victoria, these wines have increased enormously in value in the past few years. The wine has brilliant deep straw colour, an outstanding nose, showing lots of complexity induced by winemaking style and the use of wild yeasts for fermentation. An aroma of nuts, almonds and biscuit with hints of toasted oak and yeast lees presents itself. Mouthfilling concentrated palate flavours, dominated by biscuit, nut, yeast lees and toasted oak, with a manzanilla sherry like finish that lingers long into the aftertaste. This is going to set you back around \$200 and can be enjoyed with some smoked salmon on buckwheat blinis if you want to quaff it now.

The next stage of our journey took us to the town of Newman. The town is a pretty enough place and is growing rapidly due to the opening of several new mines in the area. However, the real attraction of this town is as a staging post to the surrounding areas. We were finally in the Pilbara. This is a beautiful part of Western Australia with rolling hills, awesome gorges and water holes, several National Parks of note, and of course our main destination - Ningaloo Marine Park.

After a couple of days in Newman restocking our supplies, and getting some urgent repairs done to *his* trailer, our first stop took us to a little known water hole called Wanna Munna. It is located about eighty kilometers from Newman, just off the Great Northern Highway, but is very poorly marked. The locals apparently tear down the sign-posts as soon as they are replaced, as they like to keep the place a secret from most tourists. The water hole actually comprises a series of shallow pools, set in a very tranquil little valley, and the largest water hole has only enough camping space for one or possibly two small families, making this a very private little camp site for anyone lucky enough to get there first.

The wonderful thing about this little water hole is that it is surrounded by literally hundreds of ancient Aboriginal rock carvings. These are not paintings, but carvings etched into the sandstone several millennia ago. There are carvings of people as well as of animals. Perhaps this tribe used this site as a sacred site for fertility ceremonies as many of the carved human figures have grossly enlarged sexual organs – something for our readers to dream about! We also had perfect weather for lolling about in the cool water and drying off again in the warm sun. Even better, *he* went for a walk to the next pool and would leave us in peace for several hours!

The Pilbara is also home to Karijine National Park, one of the most stunning National Parks in all of Australia, and this is where the famous Hamersly Gorge is located. 
I couldn't wait to get to the ocean and experience my first dive on Ningaloo Reef with the manta rays! The sun was shining, and life was good.

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
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q life: ONE MUM'S AMAZING LOVE

Then he left home and started to support himself.

I remember, he had just turned 18 and he came home one day and said mum I have something to tell you (I was cleaning a chicken at the time) and he said I think I'm Gay...and I said yes I think you are too. It was such a relief for him as I believe he was telling me he was Gay and he was never going to see me again. We got over that and I promised I wouldn't tell his father (who never accepted his sexuality). Then at 22, he packed up and went to Sydney - where the guys there became his new

family - he finally belonged.

I think what Ben would want me to tell you is that I supported him...and why did I - because he is mine. I joined PFLAG but ended up being more of a support for other mothers as I had fully accepted Ben but they were still having some trouble.

Since his father (who never accepted it) passed away, I believe Ben has developed much more. I remember he rang me once and said that he wanted to buy a car and that he was going to use some of his fathers inheritance (and although I made sure Ben was never left out when his father would buy his two other brothers things) it has been a turning point for Ben - he can now finally speak about his father.

He rang me once and told me that I didn't have to buy him a present for his birthday and that he knew I loved him - it was so natural - he is a joy!

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
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Q driving: the CHAIRMAN

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q pets: with CAT RESCUE

Coping with furballs.....

Cats spend up to 1/3 of their waking hours self-grooming. The tiny barbs on a cat's tongue pull loose hair from its coat and those hairs are swallowed. Because hair is very difficult to digest, it compacts with undigested food in the intestines. The result is messy fur-like, cigar-shaped forms on the floor or furniture.

Signs of hairball problems:

Fur-like, cigar-shaped clumps of fur on floor or furniture.

Dry, hacking cough.

Vomiting after meals.

Preoccupation with eating plants or grass.

Hair entwined with the faeces.

Dry dull coat and/or excessive shedding.

Poor appetite and/or weight loss.

Constipation or diarrhea.

The simplest remedy is prevention. By brushing your cat regularly, there will be less fur to be swallowed. Fur balls obstructions can be treated at home with liquid paraffin (speak to your vet for doses). The fur ball should be regurgitated or passed in the faeces. Cats should not be dosed with liquid paraffin regularly. If there is no change, then your cat needs to be examined by a vet.

Did you know?

One of the reasons cats eat so much grass is to help them vomit up fur balls. If you have an indoor cat it is important to provide it with kitty grass most pet shops stock it.

You have found stray cats and kittens?

We understand that finding or giving up a cat or kittens is an emotional experience. We will most likely be unable to take in animals in breeding



season, there are too many. 50,000 extra cats in NSW alone. That's why we offer a self help guide.

q gardening: with POOKIE

Well I hope that you all had a fantastic Christmas and New Year. I know I did, flying home to Queensland. But as I flew over the east coast and seeing first hand from 11,000 feet the amount of devastation from the bush fires and the effect from the drought has had so far it was just heart breaking. Dams, rivers, water holes and reservoirs - bone dry. Hundreds of kms of bush land burnt to the ground. There is just nothing left.

Well with my short break, I left Jayson in charge. One of her tasks was to organise the shed. "BIG MISTAKE" she organised it all right!

Every decent bit of equipment was thrown out and all the blunt and dull worn out tools were left. Not only that, but her hobby of collecting "TROLL DOLLS" and dressing them up in \$2.00 mini-frocks was more than anyone could stand.

You should have seen it - wall to wall of little ferret things doing Broadway Show tunes in the form of some type of Drag Show... "MY GOD".

Now let's talk about gardening. You might think that there is no point in gardening at this time, with the revised water restrictions, but guess again. There is heaps you can do.

Firstly, think about mulching areas of your garden. You can use just about any kind of material - wood chips are very attractive and come in many grades: for example, small pulverised pieces right up to large chunky sizes. You can create a very stunning look with the use of different grades. I have used large red gum for all the main beds, and for all the path and walk ways throughout the garden, I have chosen light tan pin bark.

The combination of red brown against the cream tan pine bark gives a striking effect. But other material is just as good. Pebbles (large or small) with a few handfuls of rock crystals (small coloured glass stones) mixed in with the pebbles looks just as good as the tan bark. Plastic or a weed mat is layed down over the soil area, then it's just a matter of distribution in a very thin layer. This type of mulch is best used in an open area where the falling debris of surrounding trees or shrubs won't cause too much maintenance. Pea straw hay is also good material and would have to be the most economical form of mulch, but they tend to break down into the soil much quicker than wood chips.

Garden compost, leaf mould, dry lawn clippings, well rotted animal manure, even sawdust, are all excellent mulches. Now you might question sawdust. Yes. This is fantastic because it also kills snails. How? It causes them

to get stuck to it. From this they cannot move and they die. Sawdust is the safest form of eradication of snails. Good and safe if you have pets.

Mulching is the best way for conserving soil moisture and protects the surface roots of plants and prevents evaporation plus the big bonus is that it discourages many weeds. When applying your materials that you have chosen do not pack it down, just lightly rake it over the soil surface of a thickness from 3 to 5 cm and always leave a space of 3 to 5 cm from the base of the trunk of each plant.

This will help water penetrate and air to circulate around your plants. Sandy soil needs more water, as this type of soil hasn't the advantage of clay soil. Sandy soil is loose and very fine grain and needs lots of organic matter to help maintain moisture and nutrients - so watering is more frequent. But remember, a good soaking encourages deep rooting, mulching aids in water conservation plus the benefits from wood chips, straw, sawdust, compost, or hay, aids in soil conditioning and food for your plants.

The second lover said, "I did! I did exactly what you said!"




